## **PRESENTATION PROPOSALS**

The highly anticipated **Asia Pacific Summit on Girls' Education** will be the premier gathering of educators, researchers, academics, and advocates for girls' education in the region.

The format of the Summit includes keynote presentations, pre-conference workshops, breakout streams, interactive panel sessions and social events designed to encourage networking and discussion on issues affecting the education of girls.

The conference will be held in Hobart, Australia.

Attendees will include senior leaders, educational professionals, academics, authors and researchers.

### **PRESENTATIONS**

#### **Concurrent breakout sessions (30-minutes)**

Concurrent breakout sessions will be held on each day of the two-day program (10–11 May). Sessions will be relevant to girls' education. The breakout sessions present a unique opportunity to inspire colleagues through the sharing of knowledge, ideas and best practices.

We are inviting proposals for presentations or experiential workshops.

The suggested format for sessions is a 30-minute presentation/workshop, including time for discussion, questions, and sharing of ideas.

## Speed presentations (5-minutes)

Speed presentations provide an opportunity to present work in a non-traditional way and feature multiple presenters on a range of topics. Presenters opting for this format are expected to engage in a five-minute speed presentation to be delivered consecutively with other speed presentations. Presenters will be restricted to a single screen visual.

Much like the well-known, original TED presentation format, speed presentations provide an opportunity to succinctly and powerfully communicate with the audience.

Presenters will be asked to indicate preferred presentation format (breakout or speed presentation). The final decision on the presentation format will be made by the Conference Committee.

## SUBMISSIONS

To submit a proposal for a presentation please complete the online submission form, including a 200-word abstract on the presentation topic and a short one-minute video briefly explaining the topic by **30 August 2019**.

The Conference Committee will evaluate submissions based on overall quality, originality, and interest to conference delegates. Selected presenters will be notified in October 2019.

### Selection guidelines

- Alignment with issues relevant to girls' education
- Appropriateness and interest of topic for delegates
- Clear content, goals and objectives
- Practical and/or immediate application in classroom or school
- Innovative ideas, thought-provoking topics, current research, recognised best practice.

Priority will be given to submissions that provide ideas, strategies and practical information that delegates can readily apply. Research-based presentations will also be highly regarded, as will presentations relevant to primary and/or secondary educators, and collaborative presentations involving two or more faculty areas and/or schools.
